
SETTLING SRI LANKA'S ETHNIC PROBLEM

Context

• India's renaming of the Jaffna Cultural Centre to 'Jaffna Thiruvalluvar Cultural Centre' reinforces its bond with Sri Lanka, addressing Tamil concerns over the initial omission of 'Jaffna'.

Historical Context: Sri Lanka's Ethnic Problem

- Colonial Era: British favored the Tamil minority in administrative and educational opportunities, creating resentment among the Sinhalese majority.
- Post Independence: Policies such as the Sinhala Only Act of 1956 and state-sponsored colonization of Tamil-majority areas further exacerbated tensions.
- Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE): Formed in the 1970s, sought an independent Tamil state, leading to a protracted and brutal civil war that lasted until 2009.

- The 13th Amendment to the Sri Lankan Constitution: It was introduced as part of the Indo-Sri Lankan Accord of 1987, aimed to devolve power to provincial councils, thereby granting greater autonomy to Tamil-majority areas.
 - However, the full implementation of this amendment remains incomplete.



Key Issues

- **Political Representation:** Tamil communities have long demanded greater political autonomy and representation.
 - The 13th Amendment aimed to devolve power to Provincial Councils, remains only partially implemented, leading to continued grievances.
- Land and Resources: Disputes over land rights and access to resources are central to the conflict.
 - State-sponsored settlements in Tamil areas and the military's occupation of land have fueled tensions.
- Language and Identity: Language policies and cultural rights are significant issues. The recognition and promotion of **Tamil as an official language**, **alongside Sinhala**, is vital for preserving Tamil identity.

Pathways to Resolution

- Full Implementation of the 13th Amendment: India has consistently urged Sri Lanka to take 'immediate and credible action' for the full implementation of the 13th Amendment and to conduct Provincial Council elections promptly that can provide Tamil communities with greater autonomy and political voice.
- **Land Reforms**: Addressing land disputes and ensuring the return of occupied lands to rightful owners can help rebuild trust and foster reconciliation.



- **Inclusive Governance:** Promoting inclusive governance that respects the rights and aspirations of all ethnic groups is essential. This includes meaningful participation of Tamils in national decision-making processes.
- **Economic Development:** Equitable economic development that benefits all communities can reduce grievances and promote social cohesion. Investment in education, healthcare, and infrastructure in Tamilmajority areas is crucial.
- **Cultural Recognition:** Promoting cultural and linguistic rights, including the use of Tamil in official communication and education, can help preserve Tamil identity and foster a sense of belonging.

International Support

- The international community, including India, has a role to play in supporting Sri Lanka's reconciliation efforts.
- Diplomatic engagement, development assistance, and support for transitional justice mechanisms can contribute to lasting peace.

Conclusion
