SC sets timeframe for President on referred Bills: Decide in 3 months

'Courts won't be powerless if... not done in reasonable time'

IN SETTING timelines for Governors to act on Bills presented to them by the state legislatures, the Supreme Court has, for the first time, prescribed that the President should take a decision on the Bills reserved for consideration by the Governor within a period of three months from the date on which such reference is received.

It said "in case of any delay beyond this period, appropriate reasons would have to be recorded and conveyed" to the state concerned.

Calling for a decision within three months is significant because under Article 201 of the Constitution no timeframe has been set for a Presidential decision.

Making available Friday its April 8 ruling that declared as illegal and erroneous the action of Tamil Nadu Governor R N Ravi in reserving 10 Bills for consideration of the President in

 The Supreme Court of India ruled that the President must decide on bills reserved by a Governor within three months, following a case where Tamil Nadu's Governor reserved bills already reconsidered by the state legislature. It also clarified that the President, like Governors, cannot exercise an "absolute veto" and must provide specific reasons for withholding assent.

Vaishnaw announces Kavach 5.0 system to increase Mumbai local services by 30%

IN A major step to upgrade Mumbai's suburban train travel, Union Minister for Railways Ashwini Vaishnaw on Friday announced that Kavach 5.0, the latestin the series of Automatic Train Protection (ATP) systems, will be implemented to increase the number of trains by 30 percent. Currently, Kavach 4.0 version is under implementation in the different parts of Indian Railways.

Kavach aids the Loco Pilot in running of trains within specified speed limits by automatic application of brakes in case Loco

ongoing with a Mumbai specific aim. Its development will be completed by the end of December. This means that if we can reduce the gap of 180 seconds between two trains by 30 percent, it means we can run 30 percent more trains. The more frequently you can run trains, it means you will be able to provide more services. So due to Kavach 5.0, we will be able to add 30 percent more trains," said Vaishnaw in Mumbai, while addressing the media on progress of a major Railways project in Maharashtra, along with Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis.

There are around 3,500 train services every day in Mumbai local and about 80 lakh people





 Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw announced that the Kavach 5.0 system will be implemented in Mumbai to increase train frequency by 30%. Set for completion by December, it aims to reduce the gap between trains and enhance safety. This initiative is part of a ₹17,000 crore infrastructure upgrade to improve services for Mumbai's 80 lakh daily commuters.
