Fourth edition of India-U.S. amphibious exercise begins





GS Paper 2-Governance

House panel suggests raising creamy layer limit from ₹8 lakh

Panel urges the Union government to take necessary steps to 'fix a substantially higher income limit' after consulting all stakeholders







- A parliamentary committee recommended raising the ₹8 lakh income limit for determining the "creamy layer" within OBCs, urging the Union government to set a higher threshold to benefit more OBCs.
- The "creamy layer" concept, introduced in 1992, excludes socially advanced OBCs from reservations.

- On the 75th anniversary of India-China relations, Xi Jinping emphasized collaboration.
- The two countries have deep ties in trade, culture, and diplomacy, focusing on resolving differences through dialogue. SpaceX's Fram2 mission: First human spaceflight to Polar Orbit set for launch on April 1

First-ever human spaceflight to polar orbit to conduct ground-breaking research, including the first X-ray in space and experiments on human health in microgravity.





• SpaceX's Fram2 mission, launched on March 31, is the first crewed polar orbit mission, where the crew will conduct 22 experiments on human health in space, including the first space x-ray.
