Historic Launch of First Commercial Coal Mine in Arunachal Pradesh at Namchik-Namphuk

Context

· Arunachal Pradesh launched its first commercial coal mining project at the Namchik-Namphuk coal block in Changlang district.

About Namchik-Namphuk Coal Block

- Location: Changlang district, southeastern Arunachal Pradesh; part of the Upper Assam coal belt region.
- Reserves: Around 1.5 crore tonnes of coal ensuring long-term production viability.
- Economic Impact: Expected to earn about ₹100 crore annually for the state.
- Environmental Features:
 - Operates under Mission Green Coal Regions.
 - Focus on land reclamation, afforestation, and eco-responsible mining.
- Social Impact:
 - o Promotes local employment.
 - Helps curb illegal mining.
- Strategic Alignment: Supports PM EAST Vision Empower, Act, Strengthen, Transform - for balanced Northeast development.

Leprosy in India: The Road to a Disease-Free **Future**

Context

• India's leprosy prevalence rate has declined from 57.2 per 10,000 (1981) to 0.57 per 10,000 (2025), a major public health achievement.

What is Leprosy?

- It is also known as Hansen's Disease.
- It is caused by the bacterium Mycobacterium leprae.
- A chronic infectious disease mainly affecting the skin, peripheral nerves, mucosa, and eyes.

Symptoms

- Discoloured skin patches and loss of sensation (touch, pain, temperature).
- Muscle weakness and non-healing ulcers.
- **Deformities** in hands, feet, and face.
- Inability to close eyes and poor vision.

Transmission

· Spread through droplets from nose and mouth during close, frequent contact with untreated cases.

Types of Leprosy

- Paucibacillary (PB):
 - Few or no bacilli on slit-skin smear.
 - Milder form.
- Multibacillary (MB):
 - High density of bacilli on slit-skin smear.
 - More severe and contagious form.

Treatment and Control

- Multidrug Therapy (MDT) introduced in 1983 revolutionized leprosy treatment.
- Early diagnosis and MDT can prevent disabilities and deformities.
- Continued focus on awareness, stigma reduction, and rehabilitation is vital for complete eradication.

Union Health Secretary Chairs High-Level Meeting with States/UTs on Quality and Rational Use of Cough Syrups

In News

• The Union Health Ministry has made compliance with revised Schedule M norms mandatory after DEG contamination in cough syrups.

What is Schedule M?

- Part of the Drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940.
- Prescribes Good Manufacturing Practices (GMP) for pharmaceuticals in India.
- Sets minimum standards for plant, equipment, hygiene, and processes to ensure drug safety and quality.

About Diethylene Glycol (DEG)

- Chemical Formula: C4H10O3
- Properties: Colorless, odorless, syrupy industrial solvent used in antifreeze and plastics.
- Not approved for pharmaceutical or food use.
- Cause of Contamination:
 - substituted for pharmaceutical-grade Industrial-grade DEG glycerine/propylene glycol.
 - Occurs due to poor quality control or cost-cutting.
- Impact:
 - Linked to fatal poisoning incidents from adulterated cough syrups such as Coldrif.

About UNESCO

- Full Form: United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization.
- Established: 1945 (Constitution came into force in 1946).
- Headquarters: Paris, France.
- Members:
 - 194 Member States
 - 12 Associate Members (as of July 2025)
- India:
 - Founding member since 1948
 - Hosts two UNESCO offices

Mandate and Objectives

- Promote peace and security through international cooperation in:
 - Education, Science, Culture, Communication

• USA announced withdrawal from UNESCO in July 2025, effective December 2026.

Can a third party be liable for marital disruption? | Explained

Context

• Delhi High Court (HC) in Shelly Mahajan vs MS Bhanushree Bahl & Anr opened the door for civil damages against third parties in cases of Alienation of Affection (AoA).

What is Alienation of Affection (AoA)?

- A common law tort also known as a "heart-balm" action.
- It allows a spouse to sue a third party (usually a lover) for wilfully interfering in the marriage.
- It involves the loss of affection, companionship, and consortium due to the third party's actions.

Status in Indian Law

- Not codified under Indian law.
- · Not explicitly prohibited either.
- · Civil action possible, if intentional interference is proved.

Judicial Precedents

- Pinakin Mahipatray Rawal vs State of Gujarat (2013):
 - Supreme Court recognised AoA as an intentional tort, if proven.
- Indra Sarma vs V.K.V. Sarma:
 - SC observed that children may also claim damages for alienation of a parent.

Supreme Court decides to examine constitutional validity of Securities Transaction Tax

In News

• The Supreme Court of India agreed to examine a plea challenging the constitutional validity of the Securities Transaction Tax (STT).

What is Securities Transaction Tax (STT)?

- A direct tax levied on securities transactions made through recognized stock exchanges.
- It was introduced under the Finance Act, 2004.
- Aimed at curbing tax evasion in the stock market.

Scope and Coverage

- Levied on transaction value (not profit/loss).
- Applies to:
 - Shares, Derivatives, Equity-oriented mutual funds
- Imposed on both buying and selling of securities.

Key Features

- Charged per transaction, irrespective of gains or losses.
- Collected at source by stock exchanges.
- Separate from capital gains tax or income tax.

Criticism

- Double taxation: Traders pay both capital gains tax and STT on the same transaction.
- Violates fundamental rights (Article 14, 19, 21):
 - o Right to equality, Freedom of trade, Right to dignity.
- Not refundable or adjustable like TDS.
- Imposes tax even when traders incur losses.
