

Crucial Facts

- Official Name: Republic of Colombia
- Location: Mainly in South America; islands in North America
- Capital and largest city: Bogota
- Government: Unitary presidential republic
- Borders: Venezuela (E&NE), Brazil (SE), Peru(S), Ecuador (SW), Panama (NW), Caribbean Sea(N) & Pacific Ocean (W).





Key Highlights



- Colombia was a Spanish colony from 1499 and **gained** independence in 1810.
- It officially became the **Republic of Colombia** in the year **1886**.
- Colombia has the third-largest and rapidly growing economy in South America.
- The U.S. has sanctioned **President Gustavo Petro** and key ministers and may cut military aid to Colombia.




Kenya

- **Borders**: Somalia, Ethiopia, South Sudan, Uganda, Tanzania, and the Indian Ocean





Key Highlights



- It was **colonized by the British** in the late 19th century and gained **independence in 1963**.
- Kenya adopted a **new constitution in 2010**, replacing the 1963 version.
- It is a presidential democratic republic, where the President is both head of state and government.
- The **economy** is the **largest in East and Central Africa**, driven by **agriculture**, **tourism**, **and services**.

Why in News?

• Ukraine has claimed responsibility for targeting the Crimea Bridge using underwater explosives.





Crucial Facts

- Location: Eastern Europe
- Connects: Black Sea and Sea of Azov
- **Separates:** Kerch Peninsula (Crimea) and Taman Peninsula (Russia)
- **Historical Names:** Cimmerian Bosporus, Strait of Taman, Strait of Yenikale
- **Kerch Bridge:** Links the Russian mainland (Taman Peninsula) with Crimea





Key Highlights



- The strait's narrowest section, near the Chushka Landspit, is only 3-5 km wide.
- The city of **Kerch**, located mid-strait on the **Crimean side**, plays a central role in the region's strategic landscape.
- The area has been a focal point of conflict since Russia's annexation of Crimea in 2014, marking a major geopolitical flashpoint.
