Himachal Pradesh Declared Fully Literate

Why in News?

• On International Literacy Day, Himachal Pradesh declared fully literate, achieving 99.3% literacy, above the national 95% benchmark.

Definition of Literacy (Census 2011)

- Literacy: Ability to read and write with understanding in any language for individuals aged 7 years and above.
- Merely being able to read does not qualify as literacy.
- Full literacy: Achieving 95% literacy rate in a State or UT.

International Literacy Day (ILD)

- Observed every year on September 8.
- Proclaimed by UNESCO during its 14th General Conference (1966).
- Originated from the World Conference on Eradication of Illiteracy (Tehran, 1965).
- 2025 Theme: "Promoting Literacy in the Digital Era."

India's Progress in Literacy

- Himachal Pradesh: 4th state to achieve full literacy (after Tripura, Mizoram, Goa).
- Ladakh: First fully literate Union Territory.
- National literacy rate: Increased from 74% (2011) to 80.9% (2023-24).

National Security Act (NSA)

Why in News?

• The Ladakh administration invoked the NSA to detain climate activist Sonam Wangchuk.

Overview

• Purpose: Allows preventive detention to protect national security, public order, and essential services.

Key Features

- Grounds for Detention: Threats to defense, foreign relations, state security, communal harmony, smuggling, or disruption of essential services.
- Procedure: Detention by Central/State Government based on subjective satisfaction; reasons must be communicated.
- Advisory Board: Formed within 3 weeks to review detention.
- Period of Detention: Initially up to 12 months; extendable in 12-month blocks with approval.
- Safeguards: Right to legal representation; can submit representation to Advisory Board; government considers recommendations.
- Judicial Review: Detention can be challenged in High Court via habeas corpus petition.
