MHA reviews AFSPA in the Northeast, Army wants more areas in Manipur under Act

Context

 The Union Home Ministry is reviewing AFSPA coverage in Manipur, Nagaland, Arunachal Pradesh, and Assam after recent disturbances.

Overview

What is AFSPA?

- Enacted in 1958, AFSPA empowers the armed forces to maintain public order in "disturbed areas."
- Provides special authority to the armed forces in regions with severe unrest.

Aim of AFSPA

- To assist civil administration in maintaining law and order.
- To control insurgency, violence, and external threats in disturbed areas.

Procedure to Declare a Disturbed Area

- The Governor or Central Government can declare an area as "disturbed."
- Declaration made via a notification in the Official Gazette.
- Reviewed every six months with possible extension or withdrawal.

Term of Enforcement

Disturbed areas are notified for six months and reviewed periodically.

States Under AFSPA (As of February 2025)

 Manipur, Nagaland, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, and Jammu and Kashmir.

Context

 Lok Sabha approved ₹50 lakh crore for 2025-26 using the guillotine method (funds approved without discussion).

Overview

• Definition:

 A proposal for expenditure from the Consolidated Fund (Article 113).

• Components:

 Includes revenue, capital expenditure, grants, and loans.

• Presentation:


 Each ministry presents its own demand; large ones may have multiple.

Approval:

- Lok Sabha can approve, reject, or reduce amounts.
- Rajya Sabha does not vote.

Presidential Approval:

Demand presented only with President's approval.

Govt notifies revisions to investment, turnover criteria for MSMEs

Context

• The Government of India has revised MSME classification criteria, raising investment and turnover limits.

Overview

About:

- Update to MSME classification based on increased investment and turnover limits.
- Announced In: Union Budget speech by Finance Minister.
- Amended By: Ministry of MSME under the MSMED Act, 2006.
- Effective From: April 1, 2025.

Purpose of Revision:

- <u>Align with Business Realities:</u> Reflect current growth trends and business conditions.
- Facilitate Growth: Support scaling-up, credit access, and market expansion.
- Promote Resilience: Encourage employment and self-reliance in the MSME sector.

Rushikonda Beach wins back Blue Flag tag

Context

Rushikonda Beach in Visakhapatnam has regained the Blue Flag certification.

Overview

About the Blue Flag Tag

- The Blue Flag is an international eco-label awarded to beaches, marinas, and sustainable boating tourism operators.
- Administered by the Foundation for Environmental Education (FEE), based in Copenhagen, Denmark.
- Globally recognized as a symbol of cleanliness, safety, and environmental sustainability.

Criteria for Blue Flag Certification

- To earn the Blue Flag, a beach or marina must meet 33 strict criteria in four main categories:
 - Environmental Education and Information
 - Water Quality
 - Environmental Management
 - Safety and Services







After Nalanda, another Bihar university now set to rise from the ruins

Context

• Efforts are underway to revive Vikramshila University a decade after Nalanda's reestablishment.

Overview

About Vikramshila University:

- Founded: By King Dharmapala of the Pala Dynasty in the 8th-9th century AD.
- Location: Bhagalpur, Bihar, India.
- Significance: Major Buddhist learning centre, second to Nalanda.
- Focus: Known for Tantric studies.

Destruction:

 Destroyed in the late 12th century by Bakhtiyar Khalji.

Atisa Dipankara:

 Buddhist scholar who revived Buddhism in Tibet during the 11th century.

Why mathematician Masaki Kashiwara was awarded this year's Abel Prize

Context

- Masaki Kashiwara awarded this year's Abel Prize.
- Honored for his work in algebraic analysis, representation theory, D-modules, and crystal bases.

About Abel Prize

- Named after: Norwegian mathematician Niels Henrik Abel (1802–1829).
- **Established:** By the Norwegian Parliament in 2002, marking Abel's 200th birth anniversary.
- First awarded: In 2003.
- Often considered the Nobel Prize of Mathematics.
- Selection Committee: Appointed by the Academy, in consultation with the International Mathematical Union (IMU) and the European Mathematical Society (EMS).
- Prize includes: A cash award and a glass plaque designed by Norwegian artist Henrik Haugan
