1. AGASTHYAMALAI BIOSPHERE **RESERVE**

Relevance: Protected Areas (Environment)

Backdrop: SC directs CEC (central Empowered committee) to survey Agasthyamalai landscape to spot encroachments into forests

In the news

The Central Empowered Committee (CEC) will conduct a survey covering the following protected areas:

- Periyar Tiger Reserve
- Srivilliputhur Grizzled Squirrel Wildlife Sanctuary (Tamil Nadu)
- Meghamalai Wildlife Sanctuary(Tamil Nadu)
- Tirunelveli Wildlife Sanctuary

This survey is an interim step aimed at:

- Initiating the restoration of pristine forest areas
- Protecting tiger habitats and other critical wildlife reserves
- Safeguarding sanctuaries located within the Agasthyamalai Biosphere

Agasthyamala Biosphere



Elevation



Flora Diversity

The reserve is primarily tropical forest and hosts 2,254 species of higher plants, including around 400 endemic species.



Genetic Reservoir

It is a significant genetic reservoir for cultivated plants, especially cardamom, jamune, nutmeg, pepper, and plantain.



Wildlife Sanctuaries & **Tiger Reserve**

The site contains three wildlife sanctuaries in Kerala -Shendurney Peppara, and Neyyar Kalakad Mundanthurai Tiger

2. CSIR-NAL- HANSA TRAINER-**PLANES**

Backdrop: CSIR-NAL signs technology transfer deal with private firm to manufacture HANSA trainerplanes

In the news:

It would be the first time that aircraft would be

- manufactured in India based on technology fully designed and developed indigenously.
- The Hansa-3 NG aircraft is a two-seater aircraft and is the latest iteration of the HANSA planes that have been made by NAL since 1998.
- HANSA-NG is powered by a Rotax Digital Control Engine with features such as a composite light weight airframe, a glass cockpit, a bubble canopy with a wide panoramic view, and electrically operated flaps.



CSIR-NAL

- The National Aerospace Laboratories (NAL) based in Bengaluru is India's first and largest aerospace research institution established by the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) in Delhi in 1959.
- The company closely operates with HAL, DRDO, and ISRO and has the primary responsibility of developing civilian aircraft in India.

CSIR

- It was established as an autonomous body in 1942 under the aegis of the Department of Scientific and Industrial Research (DSIR), Ministry of Science and Technology, Government of India.
- It is a research and development (R&D) organisation in India to promote scientific, industrial and economic growth.

Cultural Importance

- Rameswaram is a major pilgrimage site, closely linked to the Ramayana.
- The bridge plays a vital role in transporting pilgrims and goods.

Rameswaram Island

Location & Geography

- Rameswaram Island, also known as Pamban Island, is situated in the Gulf of Mannar, between mainland India and Sri Lanka.
 Lies in the Palk Strait.
 Area: Approximately 61.8 sq km.
- Closest point to Sri Lanka from Indian soil about
 30 km via the Adam's Bridge (Ram Setu).
- Surrounded by the Bay of Bengal (north) and Indian Ocean (south).
- The island has **flat terrain**, **sandy soil**, and **coastal vegetation**.

Religious Significance

One of the holiest pilgrimage sites for Hindus.

Ecological & Environmental Significance

- Part of the **Gulf of Mannar Marine Biosphere Reserve**, India's **first marine biosphere reserve**.
- Rich biodiversity: Coral reefs, seagrass beds, mangroves, and marine species.
- Important nesting area for sea turtles and breeding grounds for marine life.
- Fishing is a major livelihood; famous for dry fish, prawns, sea cucumbers, and lobsters.

The New Pamban Bridge

- India's first vertical lift railway sea bridge, a 2.07-kilometre-long marvel spanning the Palk Strait in Tamil Nadu.
- The New Pamban Bridge was constructed by Rail Vikas Nigam Limited (RVNL), a Navratna PSU under the Ministry of Railways.
- Replaces the original 1914 cantilever bridge.
- Located in Tamil Nadu, connecting Rameswaram Island to the mainland.

Key Features of the New Pamban Bridge:

- The 72.5-meter navigational span can be lifted up to 17 meters, allowing larger ships to pass underneath.
- The new bridge is 3 meters higher than the existing one, improving sea connectivity.
- The substructure is designed for two tracks, with the superstructure initially accommodating a single line.
- **Special polysiloxane coating** protects it from corrosion, ensuring longevity in the harsh marine environment.

The New Pamban Bridge is set to ensure:

- Enhanced Transportation: Accommodating heavier rail traffic and faster trains.
- Maritime Integration: Allowing larger vessels to pass without disruptions.
- Durability: Ensuring a lifespan of over 100 years with minimal maintenance.

BIMSTEC stands for the Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation. It is a regional organization that connects countries in South Asia and Southeast Asia along the Bay of Bengal.



Organisational Structure

BIMSTEC is a five-tiered organization:

- The Summit comprising the Heads of State or Government of the Member States
- The Ministerial Meeting comprising the Ministers dealing with foreign relations of the Member States
- The Sectoral Ministerial Meetings comprising the Ministers of line ministries responsible for carrying out the activities of the respective sectors
- The Senior Officials' Meeting consisting of the Foreign Secretaries/ Secretaries/ appropriate Senior officials nominated by the BIMSTEC Member States
- The BIMSTEC Permanent Working Committee (BPWC) comprises senior officials of the respective **National Focal Points.**

Priority Sectors: BIMSTEC focuses on 7 key sectors, each led by a member country:





6th BIMSTEC Summit (April 2–4, 2025, Bangkok, Thailand):

Key Area	Details
Summit Venue & Date	6th BIMSTEC Summit held in Bangkok, Thailand from April 2–4, 2025.
Bangkok Vision 2030	A long-term roadmap adopted to deepen regional integration and cooperation across multiple sectors.
Maritime Transport Agreement	Member states signed an agreement to enhance maritime connectivity, aiming to boost trade and collaboration.
Disaster Management	India to set up BIMSTEC Centre of Excellence for Disaster Management and host a joint exercise later in 2025.
Digital & Economic Collaboration	India proposed linking UPI with BIMSTEC countries' payment systems and suggested trade in local currencies and a BIMSTEC Chamber of Commerce.
Rohingya Repatriation	Myanmar confirmed 180,000 Rohingya refugees eligible to return, a key issue for Bangladesh and regional stability.
BODHI initiative,	300 young individuals from BIMSTEC member countries will receive training in India each year.

PM Modi On the Sidelines of BIMSTEC

Bangladesh

- Prime Minister Modi said"rhetoric that vitiates the environment is best avoided. Underlined India's concerns related to the safety and security of minorities in Bangladesh, including Hindus, and expressed his expectation that the Government of Bangladesh would ensure their security, including by thoroughly investigating the cases of atrocities committed against them.
- Prime Minister Modi reiterated India's support for a "democratic, stable, peaceful, progressive and inclusive Bangladesh" New Delhi has always attached 'highest priority' to its relationship with Dhaka. And the history of the two neighbours is intricately linked, and it goes back to the birth of Bangladesh.

Myanmar

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi pushed for early restoration of the democratic process in the country through "inclusive and credible elections" and called for inclusive dialogue to end the civil war in Myanmar.
- Offered to ramp up aid in the aftermath of the devastating earthquake that killed over 3,000 people.
- India has launched **Operation Brahma** to help relief efforts in the earthquake-hit Myanmar,
- Myanmar is considered a cog in the wheel for the success of BIMSTEC, whose key aim is to promote connectivity between the member nations

Nepal

- The PM said "India attaches immense priority to relations with Nepal And discussed different aspects of India-Nepal friendship, especially in sectors like energy, connectivity, culture and digital technology,"
- The MEA said "Nepal is a priority partner of India under its Neighbourhood First Policy. meeting continues the tradition of regular highlevel exchanges between the two countries,".
