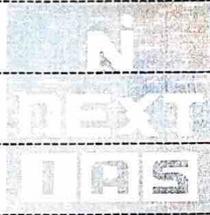

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However, the recent incident of 3 students drowning due to overflowing of a library here is what jolted the country awake to the true realities of the condition of the students here.

Every aspirant leaving the comfort of homes and the convenience of ignorance came on the streets to protest for justice and demand for safe study & living conditions.

Not just the students but renowned personalities like former IAS Panne Jain along with faculties and teachers from various institutes joined in leaving a huge impact demanding change and freedom from exploitation. However, those who chose to remain ignorant, remained so.

Hence, the measure of an individual is in deed desired

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from what choices one makes in terms of adversities & challenges. Now one chooses to stand up and face them or remain silent.

It's very easy to criticize and comment on such situations from the comfort of our homes but to actually stand up and raise a voice to change the ground realities requires courage and willingness to bring a change along with intolerance for injustice. Similar were the cases of protests in Nirbhaya case & Unstoppable's protests.

In the recent modern world, the terms 'comfort zone' and 'safe space' have become all too prominent that even in a burning world, people decline comfort from the heat. This reminds of the story of the

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frog in a pot of water whose temperature is gradually increased. The frog keeps adjusting and finding comfort in the rising temperature, till it finally is burned alive.

Hence, our comfort may be protecting us mentally but in reality it may be doing more harm than good. If you aren't standing up for a batchmate being bullied with the thought that it doesn't concern you, then some day you might be in his shoes as well.

One should enjoy while we are enjoying comforts of life. At the same time we should be grateful for being blessed enough to have them. Standing in a position of privilege, we shouldn't shirk away from the responsibilities

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when adversities arise. Like Gandhi rightfully said, "There is no service greater than service to mankind." Gautam Buddha had a royal life laid down for him but he chose the path to spread peace and dharma instead in a world of misery.

Facing challenges & controversies is a subjective response of each individual. On one hand there are those who resort to self protectionist measures as seen in cases of hoarding behaviour during COVID-19 pandemic. On the other hand, there are those who believe that actual good is the one which is good for all. exhibited by our nation through prajati Maitri in distribution of vaccines worldwide during the pandemic.

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Hence, instead of selfish & self centred responses in terms of challenges one should work towards conflict resolution that benefits all. Learnings from the lives of Raja Ram Mohan Roy and Jhnuar Chandra Vidyasagar who put tremendous efforts in improving the conditions of women by abolishing sati and allowing ^{widow} remarriage, going against the likes of Indian Society at that time.

Furthermore, one should also have the courage to stand up for one self & one's beliefs, and ~~self interests~~, not in terms of selfish gains but self interest. If one's suffering from discriminatory behaviour at work for being a woman, one should raise a voice just like Rosa Parks did.

At the same time, how one responds to challenges is an

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importance factor in determining the consequence of the end result. On one hand, Gandhiji through his non-violent Satyagrah succeeded in sending the British back leading to independence, ~~It~~ on the other hand, Hitler's attempt at purification of society led to mass genocide of the Jews. Violence does beget violence & Gandhiji was right when he said that "eye for an eye makes the whole world blind".

However, one needs to know which battles and challenges to fight for. A lost cause might not be worth fighting for. One cannot ~~be~~ fight an elephant alone & expect to win. Every person needs to be smart enough to choose the challenges in life worth fighting for, and channelize one's energy in right direction. Albert Einstein dropped out of

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school at 15 years of age and went forward to make history in field of science. Similarly, Japan after mass death & destruction in Hiroshima & Nagasaki worked towards developing themselves becoming one of the top 5 economies of the world.

However, one question still irks ² ~~7~~ what steps people take from leaving comfort and deal with issues?

Perhaps it may be the fear of failure or undesirable consequences. Another be social judgement and lack of support. Patriarchal nature of society subsumes voice of women, developed nations prevent developing nations from becoming developed, greeds prevents environmental conservation & public validation kills self confidence. Hence, one is unable to move forward to do better & be better and

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insist to accepting their conditions the way that they are.

Not facing adversities comes with its own set of challenges which leads to resorting to unhealthy defence and coping mechanisms. Guilt and regret are the most common emotions followed by grief, anger and feeling of not revenge. Attributing one's conditions to extrinsic factors rather than accepting intrinsic battles that are to be won.

we need to realise that every action has its own consequence and we would have to live with those consequences depending on our attitudes, beliefs and actions. Oppenheimer might be the father of the atomic bomb but had to forever live with guilt of causing mass destruction & death of thousands. if not millions.

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Due to actions having consequence, the great personalities of Gandhiji & Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar ji are revered as Mahatma whereas Hitler, as mass murderer.

There is a dire need to inculcate the values of selflessness and kindness in each individual. Every member of the society should feel responsible towards oneself, others and the nation to ensure incidents like the one which happened in Kaest Bagh are never repeated. Embodying values of service, courage and honesty are necessary to face the challenges in life.

Learning from the Buddhist philosophy of middle path, one needs to learn to balance between comfort and confrontation to lead a holistic and fulfilling life leading

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to development of character of a great man. To be sensitive and selfless is what one should shine for. as one of the 7 sins of Mahatma Gandhi also talked about ~~no pain with pleasure~~ without pleasure.

"A single drop never feels responsible for the flood"

"It's just one plastic wrapper", "It's just one cigarette", one hate comment, one bar of chocolate, one rude remark to a friend or just one bribe of Rs. 500. These are just some common phrases that plague today's society.

In a world of more than 8 billion people, if when every individual has the same thought

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process, they would never feel responsible towards their collective actions to oneself and others having large scale impacts like that of environmental degradation, cyberbullying, obesity and corruption.

Just like one drop doesn't feel responsible for the flood, no individual feels responsible for their actions contributing to the bigger picture.

Now, why does a single drop NOT feel responsible for the flood? The reasons could be many but to cite a few, the most common is the bystander effect where an individual feels that it isn't his responsibility to help / better

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The situation of someone else would do it. This starts a chain reaction whereby nobody takes a step forward. The increasing incidents of individuals not helping road accident victims leading to their deaths provides proof for the same.

Secondly, individuals have a tendency to focus on their selfish gains rather than others which comes at a cost. In the veil of acting in self interest, they forget about the floods they bring with them. Harshad Mehta scam and Vijay Malya's scam are known to all in this regard.

lastly, lack of self awareness and an external locus of control where one blames others for the consequences of one's own actions

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also plays an important role in preventing an individual from accepting responsibility. Uttering on the roads while blaming the poors on the streets for uncleanliness is nothing if not hypocrisy:

Moreover, each of our actions has consequences but we feel this scale is too small to make an actual difference. We tend to forget that it's only when every drop coalesces, is it capable of causing a flood. In the same way the collective ignorance or collective responsibility would determine the consequence of a single action.

Thus, it becomes crucial for every drop to recognise its responsibility

* Boond Boond se banta hai sagar

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(Every drop joins in to form an ocean) Therefore, its small effects leading to immense transformation of every one of the 1.4 billion Indians started throwing trash in bins, we would never need Swachh Bharat Abhiyan. If every individual started respecting women in the society, the whole society would flourish. If every individual became empathetic and kind, mental health of each of all would improve.

One this makes this reminds me of the childhood tale of the man of the water pot where by slowly adding stones to it, he raised the level of water & quenched his thirst. He could have lost hope but he realised the significance of his small steps leading to success. Even fruitful Bachan recognised the importance

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of one deep through his sagine
 "Ek baand gondagi ke" which has helped
 eradicate polio from India.

Accepting responsibility makes
 one a reliable and a trustworthy
individual. It improves interperson-
al relationships and the quality of
life. When each one feels is
 sensitive to their actions and
 words, it reduces conflicts and
 hence conflict resolution.

This wouldn't just benefit
 oneself but the society and
nations as a whole. The constitutional
 principles of equality and liberty
 would be upheld, the chances of
 war would be reduced & one would
 feel the safe in one's own nation. Many
 living upto the principles of vaudhava
neutumbham (one world, one family)

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However, when a deep doesn't feel responsible for the flood, it can also have drastic consequences.

Selfish interests outtake welfare hampering the growth and development of an individual as well as the society. It was a spat between a Hindu & muslim that led to the Muzzafernagar riots of 2013, only if they had accepted responsibility for their actions, the scene would be quite different today.

Further more, it leads to erosion of moral values where which brings us to the case of Pooja Khedkar who was stripped off her rank & barred from civil services for falsifying her documents.

When we don't assume collective responsibility in the society, we widen the gap between the rich & the poor.

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Capitalism remains on a rise whereas socialism as envisioned by Gandhiji starts taking a backseat. In such a scenario, it's no surprise that Oxfam report points towards the richest 1% holding more than 40% of the country's wealth.

Climate change & global warming are the consequences of lack of individual efforts while governments can't be solely blamed for lack of mitigation measures. We, as humans living on this planet often forget our responsibility towards it when we are inattentive of our actions. Use of highly polluting vehicles, polluting rivers, excessive use of plastic, littering are just some activities we carry out on day to day basis without thinking the harm it's causing in the bigger picture.

This brings us to the question of what can be done? and what

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should be done?

"Be the change you want to see".
 The first step is to stop being mere spectators and critics but actually practice what one preaches. If you're against bullying, stand up against it, against discrimination, don't make fun of your North Eastern friends, against corruption? Don't take a bribe. Start small, big changes would follow.

One action of Rosa Parks led to an entire movement against discrimination of blacks.

Practice self reflection, it helps generate self awareness of attain actualisation as also mentioned in "Maslow's hierarchy of needs". It makes an individual more mindful. Mahatma Gandhi, with his one ideology of non-violence ended the colonial rule. Gautam Buddha with his philosophy of middle path taught

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The importance of a balanced life.
 These are the self actualised
individuals who ~~the~~ were capable
 of bringing massive changes
 because they felt a sense of responsi-
 bility towards others.

Like I mentioned, a drop can
 form an ocean but at the
 same time, it can ~~form~~ cause a
 flood. it depends on the course
of action it chooses to take.

Constructionism and destruction, both
 are in the hands of the drop. Post
independence, on one hand India
 had to prosperity through its ideology
 of "Unity in Diversity", on the other
 hand Pakistan is still struggling
 for mere political and economic
 stability.

"The Butterfly Effect" is a

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beautiful concept that states that the entire world is interconnected of that one small occurrence can influence a much larger complex system such as a butterfly flapping its wings is capable of producing a typhoon elsewhere.

Hence, it's important to realise that every drop has an important role to play in causing a flood even if it might not feel so. We might not be able to feel make every drop or every person feel responsible but if we all start small and start with ourselves, we would at least be able to prevent the floods or if not, at least seek shelter against it.

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
