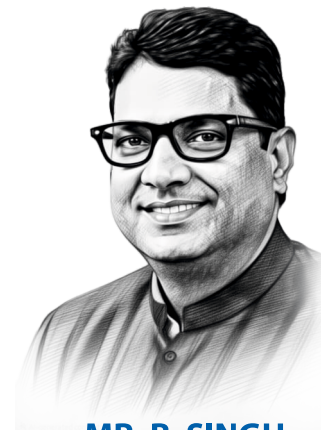

What is AIM Program?

When we built AIM, we started with a question. **What separates the students who clear this examination from the rest?** After watching enough cycles, the pattern is clear. **Four behaviours, repeated.**

Toppers keep **notes they can revise** in the last week. They **write hundreds of Mains answers and solve thousands of Prelims questions** until both feel routine. They have **someone experienced telling them where to focus**, what to set aside, and when to stop second-guessing. Underneath, they have a **real structured plan** that holds steady. AIM is built around these four behaviours. We teach the system that produces them, week after week, for fifteen months.

This program is demanding. Some students consider stepping back mid-way. Those who stay walk into the exam hall having done the work they came to do. There will be no question of whether you could have prepared more.

What sets toppers apart is not luck. It is a process.

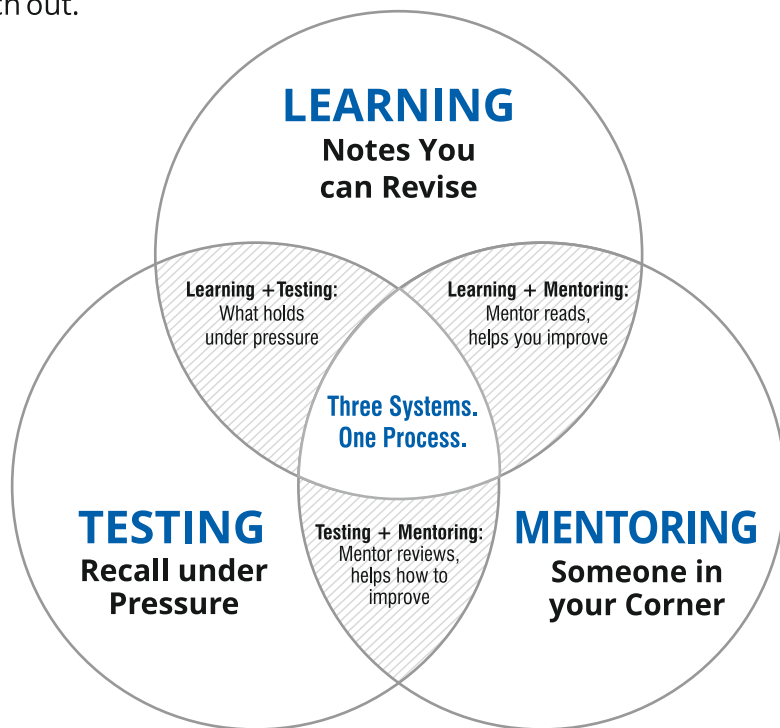

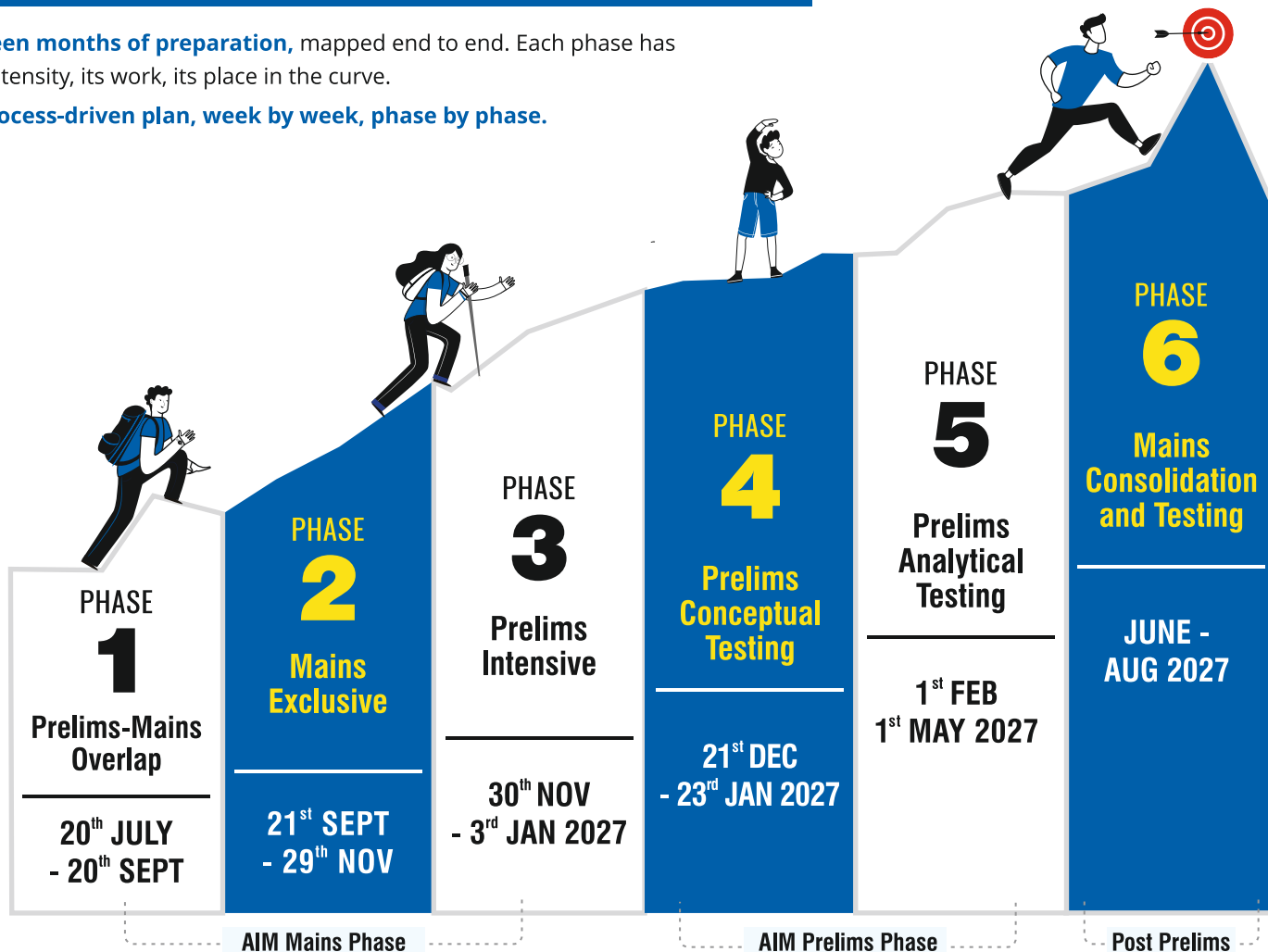

Every theme comes with an **approach, a reference solution, a visual explanation**, and the best cohort assignments. You see what good looks like before writing the next.

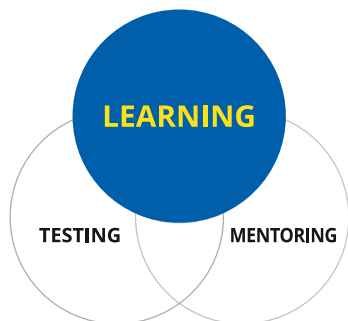

What's Included in the AIM Program?

Prelims Phase | October to May 2027 **LEARNING**

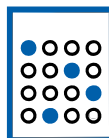
THE SHIFT STARTS IN OCTOBER

Phase 3 covers the **high-Prelims-relevance subjects**: Modern History, Environment, Science and Tech, Art and Culture. You stay on the Mains track in your workbook. The subjects you cover now are the ones **Prelims tests most**. By December, the **orientation has shifted**.



CONCEPTUAL LEARNING THROUGH STRUCTURED MCQs

Phase 5 walks you through every **Prelims subject's foundational layer**: themes UPSC tests year after year, basic concepts, the NCERT content the paper keeps returning to. Five days a week of **MCQs covers this ground**. Phase 6 escalates the same content to **UPSC-level analytical testing**.



SESSIONS, HANDOUTS, AND CSAT SUPPORT

Through Phases 3 to 6: dedicated **Prelims value-addition sessions** on focus areas, strategy sessions on approaching the subjects, handouts on current affairs and high-yield static topics, and offline **CSAT accelerator** sessions for the second-paper.



***The Principle.** The **spacing effect**. You retain content longer when it returns at intervals. Across five months, the same Prelims content surfaces in MCQ form, then in analytical form, then again in simulators, building durable retention.

TESTING Mains Phase | June to December



THE WEEK'S THEMES RETURN AS UPSC-STYLE QUESTIONS

For five days, you research and **write workbook assignments**. The questions are straightforward, designed to **provoke thought and generate notes**. On Sunday, the same themes return in the **assessment test**, layered in the language and complexity UPSC uses. The assessment shows whether the week's **research becomes writing UPSC accepts**.

HALF TEST WITH SCAFFOLDING, FULL TEST WITHOUT

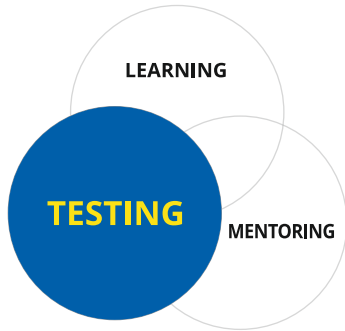
Early in each subject, you write half tests. The questions carry **hints and nudges**, suggesting approaches to try and giving proactive feedback. As the subject closes, you write a full test, **scaffolding removed**, under conditions **closer to the real paper**. You experiment when stakes are low, then execute without aid once the technique settles.

DETAILED EVALUATION FOR EVERY ASSESSMENT TEST

Assignment questions are **research prompts: open book, unevaluated**, designed to generate crisp notes. Assessment tests are different. Every paper is **reviewed in detail, with feedback** on structure, content, and how to improve your writing. You receive a **reference solution**, a **visual explanation**, and the **best peer answers** from the cohort. You see what worked and where to sharpen, before the next test.

***The Principle.** The **testing effect**: you retain content further when you retrieve it under pressure. The **scaffolding effect**: you learn a skill faster with help, then practice it without. The assessment test makes you retrieve. The half-test-to-full-test progression makes the scaffolding fade.

Prelims Phase | December to May 2027 **TESTING**

CONCEPTUAL TESTING FIVE DAYS A WEEK

Phase 5 starts the testing rhythm. Five days a week of **50-question GS MCQ tests on the conceptual layer** and **CSAT PYQ** worksheets of every Prelims subject. The themes UPSC tests year after year, the basic concepts, the NCERT content the paper keeps returning to. By the end of January, the **concepts are in place and the recognition is automatic.**

ANALYTICAL TESTING THREE DAYS A WEEK

Phase 6 escalates the difficulty. **Three days a week, you write tests at UPSC-paper level.** The format rotates through **sectional tests, full-length tests, simulators, ANUBHAV, and CSAT papers.** Each format trains a different Prelims skill: deep recall on a single subject, full-syllabus integration, exam-condition endurance, cohort calibration, and second-paper competence.

FROM BASICS TO EXAM HALL

By the time you sit for Prelims, you have **written more tests in this program than most aspirants take across two complete preparation cycles.** Your scores feed mentor input each week. Your weakest subjects gets the attention it deserves. By Prelims week, the test hall is the room you have been writing in for five months.

***The Principle.** *The **progressive overload effect**: skills build faster when difficulty rises in steps.*

What's Included in the AIM Program?

MENTORING June to May | The Dedicated Mentor

For twelve months, you have one mentor. Someone who reads your assignments, reviews your tests, follows up when you go quiet, and tells you what to do next. **This relationship is the spine of the program.**



READS YOUR WORK, EVERY WEEK

Your mentor reviews your **assignments, analyses your assessment test answers, and closes the question of which standard sources** you should be reading. They know **what you are getting right, what you keep getting wrong**, and what is not yet showing up in your work.

REACHES OUT BEFORE YOU DO

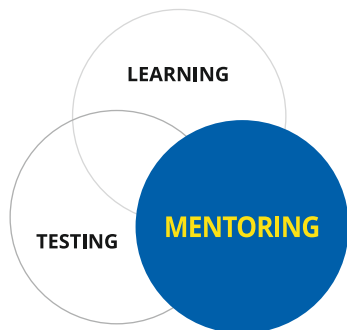
When you go quiet, your mentor reaches out. **Through mail, message, or a call when the pattern needs it.** Group sessions on PYQs and test discussions run alongside individual review. The **accountability is built in. You are not preparing on your own time, alone.**

TELLS YOU WHAT TO FOCUS ON NEXT

Each week, your mentor tells you **what to keep doing, what to drop, what to fix before the next test. The advice is specific to you, not generic.** Most aspirants make their year-shaping decisions based on YouTube videos and Telegram threads. You make yours based on someone who has read your last six months of work.

What's Included in the AIM Program?

June to August 2027 | The Specialist Panel **MENTORING**

Phase 7 is the run-up to the actual Mains paper. The relationship layer that carried you through twelve months stays in the background. Different mentors for different needs, each one specialising in the kind of feedback the final stretch demands.

SPECIALISTS FOR EACH PAPER. SPECIALISTS FOR EACH SKILL

Five specialists across the panel.

Answer Writing Specialist for technique and structure. Ethics Specialist for GS Paper 4. Essay Specialist for the standalone paper. GS Paper 2 Specialist for Polity and IR. GS Paper 3 Specialist for economy, environment, and security. **Each one has read enough Mains scripts to know what scores and what does not.**

GROUP SESSIONS AND ONE-TO-ONE FEEDBACK

Specialist work runs through scheduled **group sessions and individual consultations**. Group sessions cover patterns across the cohort: common mistakes in essay structure, ethics case study traps, recent question trends. **One-to-one feedback** covers your specific writing: what your last paper revealed, what to fix in the next.

YOUR DEDICATED MENTOR STAYS IN THE BACKGROUND

Your relationship with your dedicated mentor does not end. The day-to-day work **shifts to the specialists**, but the mentor remains in contact, checking in, available when the relationship matters more than the technical input. **The handoff is structural. The connection is not.**

***The Principle.** *The **expertise effect**. Specialised feedback in the final phase produces sharper improvement*

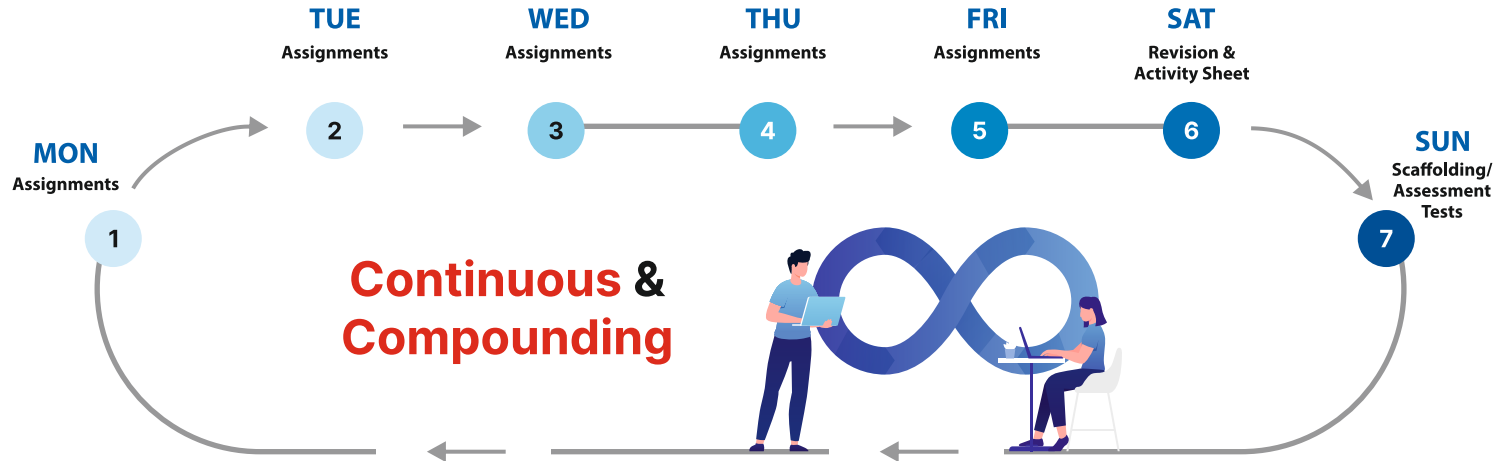

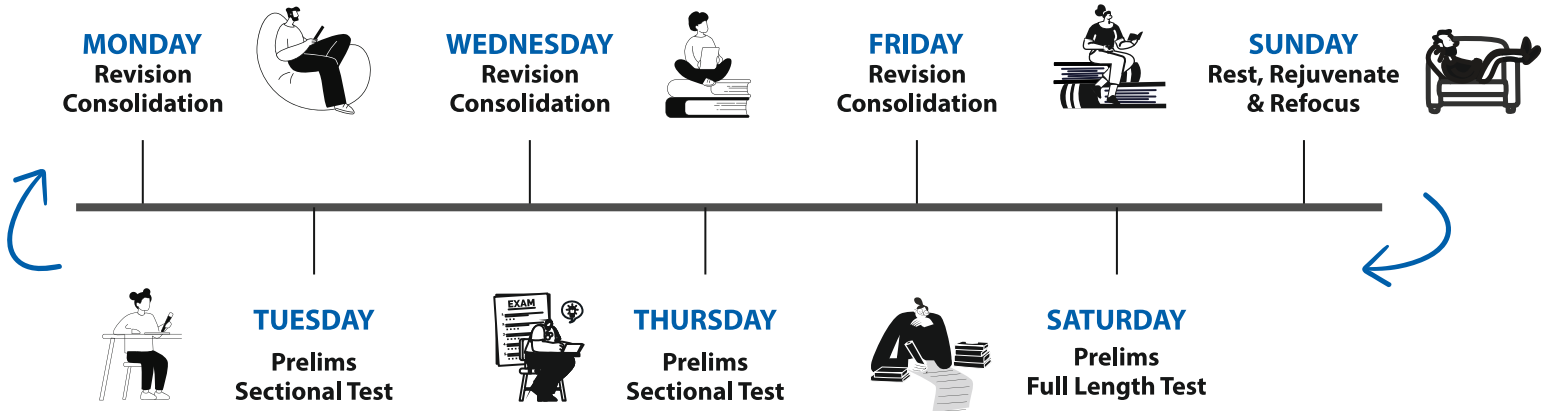

How AIM Works, in Six Words



Workbook

Your **subject-wise notebook**, structured into **daily assignments**. Space to **brainstorm, summarise, and build understanding** one topic at a time, on a schedule the program sets for you.



Assignment

A **Mains-style question**, set on the syllabus you have just covered. You write it. You compare your answer with **model answers and approach guidelines**. You discuss your gaps with a mentor.



Assessment

A **weekly test** on the subject you have just finished. You **write under time pressure**, you get a **marked paper** back with **mentor feedback**, and you walk into the next week knowing exactly where you stand.



Anubhav

A **national-scale open test** that brings together aspirants from **across the country**. The benchmark that tells you where you stand against the **actual competition pool**, on the UPSC standard paper.



Thematic Rewind

A **theme-by-theme revision** of your **workbook assignments**, built for the **post-Prelims clock**. The **minimum revision** that gets you the **maximum coverage** in the months between Prelims and Mains.



Phase

A **distinct stretch of the AIM journey**, calibrated for a specific kind of work. Each phase has its own **intensity**, its own **focus**, and its own **role** in your preparation.

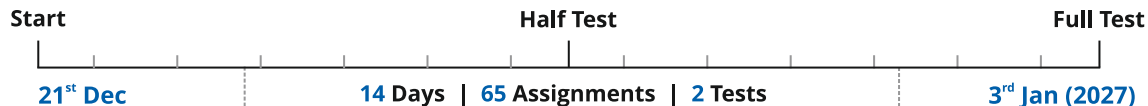

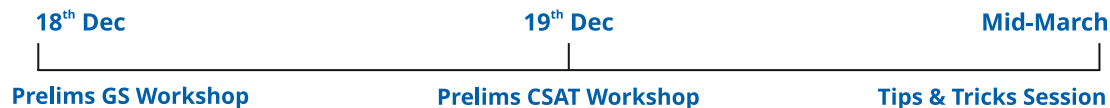

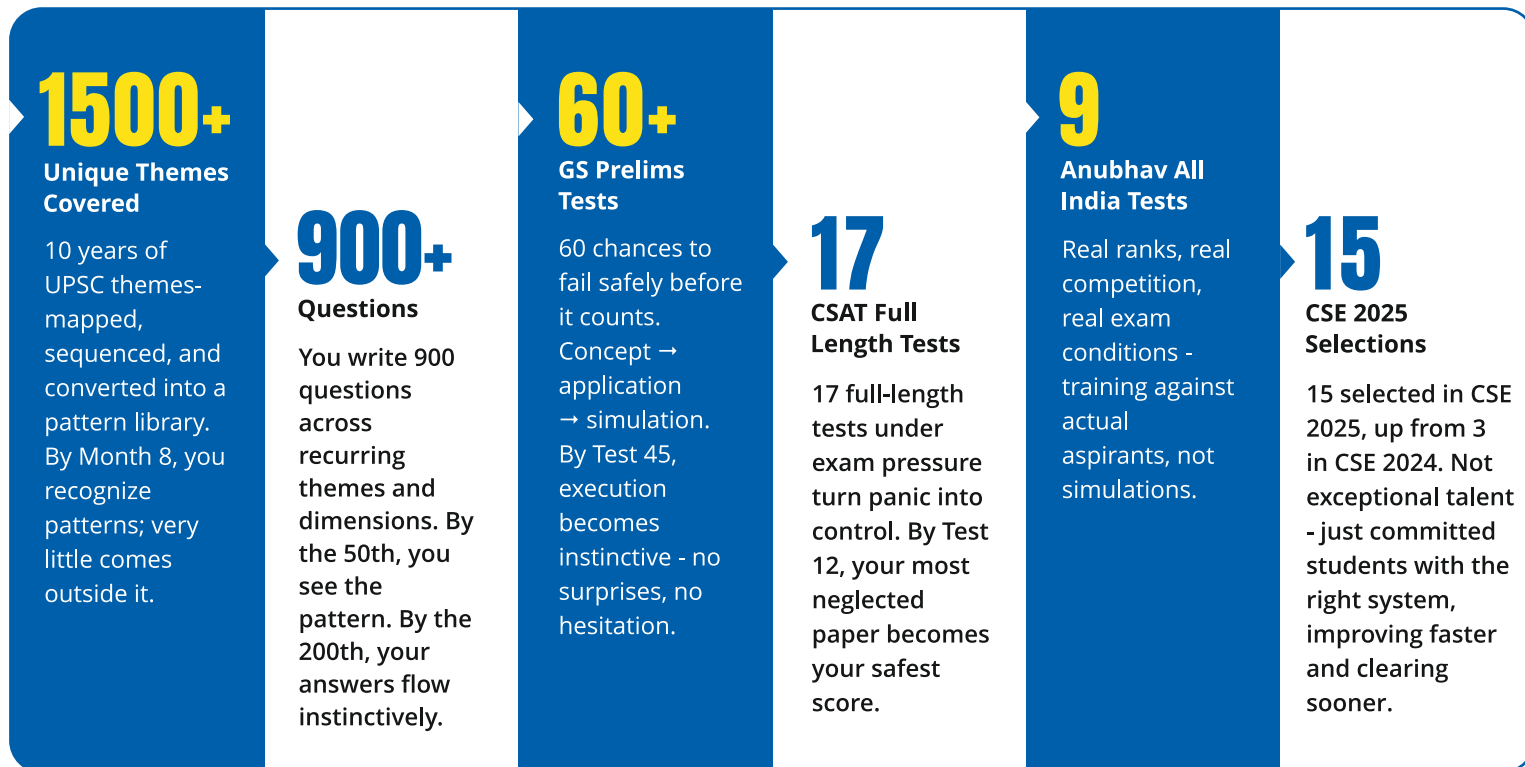
