1. **Courage; determination** that makes it possible for somebody to continue doing something difficult or unpleasant.
2. Also: **Grasp. Recall. Integrate. Test.** The four things you will do every week, for the next 4-5 months.

GRIT is an 4-5 months base-building programme. The prelims syllabus put in place, subject by subject, before preparation turns into a sprint. **One rhythm, every week.** You read. You are tested on what you can remember and on how UPSC has asked it. Most aspirants read a subject once, test once, and move on. By February they are still on basics when they should be building speed.

GRIT exists so that you are not one of them.

The Principle. *The testing effect. You retain what you retrieve, far better than what you re-read. Two retrievals a week, for eighteen weeks.*

THE GRIT PLAN



WHAT IT IS: Six subject blocks and a consolidation fortnight, 14th September to 24th January. The **prelims syllabus read, recalled, integrated and tested**, one subject at a time, with one planned break (9–15 November) and room to get things corrected before it matters.

WHAT IT IS NOT: A revision course, a crash course, or a test series you fit around your own plan. GRIT sets the reading order and it sets the test days. Phase 2 · PTS Booster follows from 1st February.

2. Also: the **4 months from 1st February** to the exam. Forty-six papers, alternate days, no new syllabus.

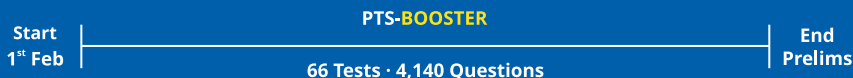

Most aspirants spend February to May revising, because revision feels productive. It is the thing that moves the needle least.

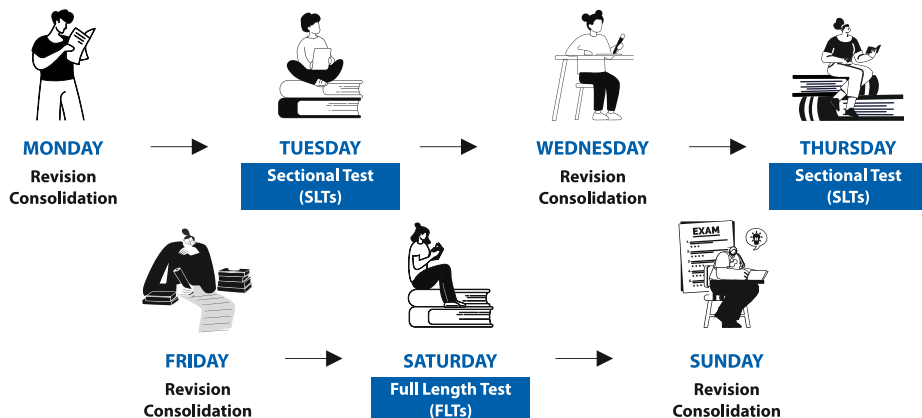
THE BOOSTER PLAN
